You've made me so very happy honey. Darling I'm so in love with you.

Dear, I got a stack of mail again last night, and all of yours were of my old address. But still no packages. Honey tell the postmaster that I want you to send me some shrimp with sauce, cookies & candy.

Nothing new today honey. I give the war just about 10 more days if Stalin keeps going. It's still cold over here & plenty of snow. Well my darling, I must close now. So dearest darling of mine goodbye for now & honey remember that I love you with all my heart. Call Gert & tell her I'm O.K.. No time to write her. Tell Pop hello & Mitzi.
